Mr. Ian Weeks

Members of the SHRA committee were very sad to learn that Ian Weeks passed away suddenly on the 16th May.

As well as playing an active campaigning role as a SHRA committee member for twelve years, Ian was the long-time writer, editor and producer of *Waterlines* - from Issue No. 1 in May 2005, through more than 80 printed editions and 15 PDF versions until April 2017. Indeed, *Waterlines* owes its existence to Ian, and he worked hard to produce monthly editions for its first five years before switching to publishing an edition every second month, as we do now.

Some of you will remember that until 2014 *Waterlines* was a printed publication delivered to every Sovereign Harbour home. In those days, Ian would receive a delivery from the printers of three or four thousand copies that he then delivered to the North and South Harbour volunteers who would walk the streets to pop them through the letterboxes of every residential property.

Along with others, Ian fought against the building of a B&Q store on Site 6 and protested against building more houses and flats without the provision of the promised but long-awaited community facilities, including the Community Centre. He also campaigned tirelessly on the annual rentcharge, arguing that it was unfair and that the residents who pay it should be represented on the board of the Sovereign Harbour Trust. We offer our sincere condolences to Ian's wife, Jan Weeks, past chair of SHRA, and their family and friends. Ian's funeral service will be held at Eastbourne Crematorium, Main Chapel, on Friday 23rd June 2023 at 12pm. Memories and tributes may be left online at: <https://ianweeks.muchloved.com>

New council leadership for Eastbourne

Eastbourne Borough Council has a new Council Leader and Cabinet following the local elections on May 4.



At a meeting of Annual Council (May 24), Councillor Stephen Holt (pictured) was confirmed as the new Leader of Eastbourne Borough Council and Councillor Margaret Bannister as Deputy Leader.

Councillor Holt was first elected in 2015 and since 2020 has been Deputy Leader of Eastbourne Borough Council.

The local elections saw the Liberal Democrats increase their number of seats to 19. The Conservatives now have eight seats.

Councillor Stephen Holt said:

“It is an absolute privilege to be appointed Leader of Eastbourne Borough Council. To be given the opportunity to lead the council of such a wonderful town is an honour that I do not take lightly.

“I am also delighted that Margaret Bannister is the Deputy Leader and can't wait to start working with her in this new role. Margaret has many years of experience as a Cabinet councillor and knows Eastbourne and the town's residents better than anyone.”

Lifeboat to be Replaced

At SHRA's AGM, Eastbourne's RNLI Operations Manager Carl Pocock confirmed that the current 'all weather' lifeboat *Diamond Jubilee* (16-23) is to be replaced in the near future. The RNLI constantly review their stations' operational needs and a decision to relocate a vessel is never taken lightly.

The *Diamond Jubilee* is a Tamar Class lifeboat that has served Eastbourne for the past ten years. The replacement boat will be a Trent Class 14m 'all weather' lifeboat, a slightly older boat but one that has had a recent refit. All weather lifeboats (ALBs) are capable of high speed and can be operated safely in all weather conditions. They are inherently self-righting after a capsize and fitted with navigation, location, and communication equipment.

Harbour WI - Meeting Report

At our May meeting members were greeted by a very festive hall decked out in red, white and blue to celebrate the King's Coronation. The committee had also baked scones to a 'secret recipe' supplied by Sandie Goman.

President Jacquie Frost welcomed everybody; and the speaker for the month, Trevor Weeks of WRAS East Sussex Wildlife Rescue, was introduced by Diane Beere.

Trevor has visited the Harbour WI before and is always a popular speaker. He told how he had established the WRAS Wildlife Charity in 1996 as a volunteer. He was a one-man band to start with.



Today there are 5 fulltime staff, 7 part time and 170 volunteers. He now spends most of his time in the office as there is so much paperwork!

They receive 8,500 to 10,000 calls a year; up to 125 a day during the busy season of May, June, July and August. Their fleet of 2 ambulances, 2 cars and a patient transport vehicle can take an average of two and a half hours to deal with each case. Finding the animals that need help can be a problem. They have usually moved on from where they were first seen.

The animals they treat are extremely varied. From horses to frogs! Trevor showed slides and a video of the numerous rescues and facilities. They have a dedicated hedgehog hospital [in Cathy's back garden!], an orphan centre and a casualty centre in Whitesmith near Lewes. They employ their own vet and are on call 24 hours a day. All this costs around £360,000 a year and is funded solely by donations and legacies. Trevor was thanked by Diana Groot-Copp and a donation box was passed round the members.

Daphne Chamberlain read out various correspondences from the ESFWI including a list for anyone wanting next year's diary!

After a cream tea with delicious light scones, Carole Kilby tested the members on their 'Royal' knowledge with a quiz. The winning team received a certificate and chocolate.



The Craft Club meet at Sandie Goman's house on the 22nd May and the 4th Tuesday Club will meet for coffee in Four Seasons on the 23rd May. The Lunch Club are going to The Smugglers in Pevensy on the 30th May.

New Exhibition at The Beachy Head Story

Visitors to Eastbourne's Beachy Head Story will have an opportunity to explore tales of buried treasure, dragons guarding golden hoards, gold lost at sea and flashes of gold in nature with the opening of a new exhibition.

Gold – The Treasure of a Town is now open with free entry. The new exhibition uncovers some of the treasures discovered in Eastbourne and the surrounding Downland and has them on display.

Among the exhibits is a brass ring made by a convalescing soldier at Summerdown Camp in Eastbourne during the First World War. It was recovered during an excavation of the last remaining piece of land that the camp once inhabited 100 years after it was made. It bears the letters S C H E for Summerdown Camp Hospital Eastbourne.

The exhibition was inspired by a chance find of a golden nugget in the sea 100 years ago and visitors can discover golden words from a medieval book of hours, threads of gold chosen to make the ordinary extraordinary and Saxon treasure buried for more than 1,000 years.

Also on display is a Posie ring, which were very popular between 1400 and 1750 and this silver gilt example dates from the 1600s. The inscription reads 'F'eare the Lord' and its placement on the inside of the ring was meant to bring the wearer closer to the message and in this case was an inward show of religious piety. It was found at Arlington.


Bronze axes found at Combe Hill in Willington, Royal Naval and Coastguard buttons found during excavations at Coastguard Cottages at Crowlink, medals, Iron Age coins and Saxon brooches can also be viewed.

Entry to the exhibition at The Beachy Head Story, next to the Beachy Head Pub, is free and it is open daily from 10am-5pm, including on bank holidays.

The exhibition is one of a series of events that regularly take place at the Beachy Head Story. Over the summer months, the venue will host creative writing workshops, children's activities and walks on the Downland.

There is also a gift shop selling ethically and locally sourced projects from independent makers and artists, celebrating Beachy Head's unique location.

Dog Wounded on North Beach

On Easter Sunday 8th April 2023, a dog, was seriously injured, whilst walking on the beach in North Harbour with it's owner. The dog was pierced by two fishing hooks, one in his mouth and one in his paw. The owner did not realise why the dog was not responding to her call. She went to see why he was struggling to walk up the bank, and she noticed a fishing hook on his paw, with blood. She then saw another hook in his mouth. It was impossible for her to take the hooks out, and therefore she tried to see if anyone walking nearby had something sharp to cut them. But it was not possible to find anyone around who could help. Eventually she struggled back home with the dog.



It was extremely difficult for her to deal with removing the hooks as the dog was in so much pain, and eventually the poor dog was rushed to an emergency vet, who then had to sedate him as he was an old dog and there were risks as the hooks were in so deep. It was worrying that he may not wake up. Even with all the sedation, pushing the hooks through took two vets to hold him down, and it took over an hour to get both hooks out. The hooks were so thick that it was impossible to cut them with a set of wire cutters.

It's terrible that something so small can cause so much injury and trauma and the poor dog was whimpering throughout the operation despite being sedated. Pets are like family, and the owner thought she was going to loose him, and she was extremely upset, as was her little girl. Besides all the trauma this family went through with the upset and anxiety of seeing their beloved dog suffering, they had a vet's bill of £800 to pay, all because of the negligence of someone leaving their fishing hooks discarded on the beach.

This kind of an incident could easily happen to children or adults, or those who swim in the sea, not to mention wildlife.

We hope this report will act as a warning to all who use the beach to look out for discarded fishing hooks, and those who use our beach for fishing, we urge you to please take your discarded fishing items back with you and dispose of them properly. This also includes litter and bottles which have also been seen discarded on the beach.

Cooking with Faz Razeen

Chicken Penne Arrabbiata

Arrabbiata" means "angry" in Italian is the spicy sauce for pasta made from garlic, tomato sauce, chilli flakes or fresh red chilli cooked in olive oil.

Chicken Arrabbiata pasta is a simple classic Italian dish which is easy to make. This dish is made with penne pasta, chicken breasts, garlic, onions and tomato sauce finished with grated Parmesan.

INGREDIENTS

- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 450g chicken breast, cut into small cube size pieces
- 300g penne pasta
- 2 medium size tomatoes chopped
- 1 medium onion, finely chopped
- 2-3 large garlic cloves finely chopped
- 1 teaspoon red chilli flakes
- 2 tablespoons tomato puree
- 400g tin chopped tomatoes
- 30g freshly grated Parmesan
- Salt and pepper for seasoning



METHOD

Bring a large pan of water to a boil, add salt generously and cook the pasta al dente according to the instructions on the package.

Meanwhile, heat the olive oil in a large frying pan and cook the chicken breast for 4-5 minutes over medium-high heat until no longer pink.

Stir in the onion, garlic, chopped fresh tomato and red chilli flakes and continue to cook for another minute.

Add the tomato paste and chopped tin tomatoes and stir to combine. Lower the heat and simmer for 10 minutes until the sauce thickens.

Add the tomato puree and chopped tin tomatoes

Season to taste and bring to a simmer. Lower the heat and simmer for 10 minutes until the sauce thickens.


Transfer the cooked pasta to the large frying pan and stir in the Parmesan and basil. Serve immediately with grated Parmesan on top if you like.


